The Shelburne Police Service and Dufferin OPP are working together on the project.

Officers will have an information booth set up and will collect unused and expired drugs on Saturday May 9th from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the rear parking lot at the Shelburne Police Service located at 203 Main Street East.

There will be no questions asked at this event. The purpose is to get unused prescription drugs safely disposed of so that they cannot end up in the wrong hands or be abused. Prescription drug abuse, addiction and trafficking have increased significantly in the past 10 years including in our communities! Please help keep our communities a safer place by dropping off your unused or expired prescription drugs at this event!
