He has been very helpful helping Jeanne prepare materials for the Story time crafts amongst other things. We always appreciate having a student helper during the term and I know we also support them in their skill development with particular emphasis on attention to detail, customer service, and team work concepts.

We are now able to provide Computer Classes again for our patrons. With the help of our students we will offer one-on-one computer assistance on such topics as setting up your email, word processing, Internet searching etc. These will start on Monday, May 27th and we will have a sign-up sheet at the library. The students will provide the support for about an hour for each patron. It is helpful if you can give us an indication of what you want to learn so the students can prepare if they are not familiar with the topic. However, I'm quite sure they have expertise in most areas in which our patrons will need help. These computer classes were very popular when we held them before and they are back by popular request!
