

B&E in Barrie leaves many without Internet access

Crime Stoppers of Simcoe-Dufferin-Muskoka along with the Barrie Police Service are requesting the assistance of the public in solving this crime.

On November 4th, at 6:26 a.m. police were called to 520 Bryne Drive to investigate an attempted break and enter and mischief at a commercial building complex.

Police learned that an unknown suspect broke into the electrical room and deliberately cut the main fibre optic cables for Compu-SOLVE. Compu-SOLVE is a company that provides Internet access and communications to major businesses throughout Simcoe County.

As a result of this mischief, all of Compu-SOLVE's clients were without Internet access and regular business operations were effectively shut-down for much of the day. The financial loss is unknown.
