## Dufferin remembers former warden Bill Hill

Dufferin County is mourning the loss of one of its former wardens and Melancthon Mayor, Bill Hill, after a brief battle with cancer.

Mr. Hill served on Shelburne, Melancthon and Dufferin County councils. Also sitting on the Upper Grand District School Board (UGDSB), he was first elected as a councillor in Shelburne back in 1983. After six years, he moved to Melancthon, where he was elected as a councillor in 1998. He served as the township's deputy mayor in 2008 prior to being elected mayor in 2010. He then served as Dufferin County's warden in 2014 before retiring from politics.

"He was always fair," said Melancthon Mayor Darren White, who served as a councillor and deputy mayor during Mr. Hill's time.

"He had a wealth of knowledge," Mayor White spoke of his predecessor as one who respected everyone's beliefs. "He didn't necessarily agree with everybody, but he certainly respected your belief, and he tried to understand where you were coming from before he made a decision. He was willing to listen, he'd get the information from all the sides, and make a decision based on that."

The mayor added that he probably wouldn't have been as successful in municipal politics without "learning from Bill."

Mr. Hill faced several challenges during his time in Melancthon, particularly stopping the mega-quarry, and as the county's warden, dealing with the Green Energy Act and the county's first official plan. He was also the driving force behind the development of the annual scholarship program that Dufferin County offers for students pursuing higher education and apprenticeships.

"We lost one of the most community-minded men that I have ever had the privilege to work with," said current Warden Paul Mills. "As a colleague and a true friend, Bill Hill will be truly missed by all of us."

"Everybody looked to him for leadership and they certainly got it," said Mayor White. "I think you'd find a hard time finding anybody in local political circles that didn't have a high level of respect for Bill and what he did."

On Tuesday, flags at Dufferin County's courthouse were flown at half-mast to honour the lasting contributions of Mr. Hill.

Celebrations of Mr. Hill's life will be held at the Washago Community Centre on April 22nd and the Shelburne Legion on May 12th, both from 1:00 p.m. to 5 p.m.

# Provincial candidates largely negative on Liberals’ 2018 budget

In a dramatic, yet not altogether shocking, turn of events, the Liberal government last week completed something of a political U-turn, unveiling an ambitious 2018 budget that calls for a return to deficits, with substantial spending and investment across Ontario.

In his presentation to Queen’s Park last Wednesday, Finance Minister Charles Sousa spoke at length about planning for a brighter future in Ontario. Not that the past hasn’t been great, Mr. Sousa says, citing Ontario’s growing economy, which he claims is the best among all Canadian provinces and better than all G7 nations. Still, the government is forecasting for a \$6.7 billion deficit this year to improve on what has already been improved on in recent years.

The Liberals identified three key pillars in the budget, which Mr. Sousa noted would help all Ontario residents – making life in Ontario more affordable, helping everyone get the care they need and creating more opportunities that benefit all Ontarians. Top projects include providing free prescription drugs for all seniors, offering free preschool child care for families and improving mental

health services across the province.

The budget also provides \$935 million in new funding to support well-paying jobs, a home maintenance boost of up to \$750 every year for seniors 75 and over who run a household, better services for Ontarians with developmental disabilities and free college and university tuition for more than 225,000 students.

Dufferin-Caledon MPP Sylvia Jones was, unsurprisingly, heavily critical of the budget, calling it a “flip flop” by the Liberals.

“That could not have been more of a pre-election budget,” Ms. Jones told the Free Press. “After spending weeks crisscrossing the province making promise after promise, after years of neglect and mismanagement, we are expected to forgive and forget.”

She added, “Unfortunately, the Liberals attempt to buy the votes of Ontarians with their own tax dollars will not make people forget the 15 years of scandal, waste and mismanagement.”

For Bob Gordanier, Dufferin-Caledon’s Liberal candidate, this wasn’t an altogether bad budget. With investments that he believes will positively impact upon all Ontarians’ way of life, he commended Mr. Sousa and his team for their hard work in

putting together a plan to improve the way of life for millions of residents across the province.

“The Liberal government’s 2018/19 budget is good news for the people of Dufferin-Caledon, who deserve a government that will invest in the programs, services and infrastructure that make the biggest difference,” Mr. Gordanier said. “This budget is one of the most progressive and people-focused Ontario has ever seen. Unprecedented investments in health care, long-term care and child care will help families live full and meaningful lives.”

Mr. Gordanier pointed out the budget commits to an additional \$500 million over three years to expand broadband connectivity, increasing access to pharmacare and providing more money for seniors to help maintain their home.

“This builds on five years of milestone achievements for the Liberal government, including free prescription drugs for youth, much-needed investments in long-term and home care, and the largest infrastructure investment in Ontario’s history,” Mr. Gordanier stated. “With this budget, it is very clear where the Liberal government stands heading into the next election. This government is committed to making investments in case so everyone in Ontario can thrive.”

“We simply must make child care affordable for every family in Ontario. Not just for the parents of children of certain ages, but”-for the parents of every age,” she said.

Infant and toddler care is the most expensive and must be addressed for women to have a “real choice” to return to work after having a baby, she said, adding details will be released in the NDP election platform.

Libertarian candidate Jeff Harris says he’s seen and heard enough from the current Liberal government. He criticized their 2018 budget for its dependence, once again, in borrowing money to pay for key services.

“I thought it was bad news to the taxpayers, that now the government borrows the money we’re going to have to pay back later,” Mr. Harris said. He pointed out that interest on the provincial debt has risen to an eye-watering \$12 billion per year and that the government is now borrowing to cover those payments.

“It makes no financial sense at all,” Mr. Harris added.

While the Liberals have made note of concerning statistics regarding the number of Ontarians dealing with substance abuse or mental health problems – one in four residents according to the sitting government – to justify the increase in spending, Mr. Harris believes that is simply typical pre-budget propaganda.

He added, “Only the Ontario Liberal team has a plan to make the investments people in Dufferin-Caledon need and deserve.”

Despite Mr. Gordanier’s rousing approval of the budget, other candidates in Dufferin-Caledon were not so enthused with the document. Green candidate Laura Campbell labelled the budget “irresponsible”, stating it was something Ontario, in its current state, could not afford.

She added the Green Party supports most of what the government is proposing, but she stressed the need to be honest about how it’s all going to be paid for. She agreed more money is needed for things like hospitals, mental health and caring for seniors.

“I just don’t trust the Liberals to do it in a way to keep the Province fiscally stable over the next 10 to 15 years,” Ms. Campbell told the Free Press. She noted that, had the Liberals spent money on these policies over the past 15 years, they wouldn’t need to invest so drastically today.

The New Democratic Party hasn’t nominated a candidate in Dufferin-Caledon, but leader Andrea Horwath said Monday the NDP would “do better” than the Liberal government’s plan to offer free child care for preschoolers starting in 2020.

“I think we can actually do better,” the NDP leader told a gathering of more than 2,000 child-care workers employed by the YMCA of Greater Toronto, the province’s largest child-care operator.

“I think they’re exaggerating the numbers,” he said. “I just don’t believe it.”

Trillium Party candidate Andrew Nowell also expressed his concern with the budget, believing it underestimates the people of Ontario.

“To me, it’s just adding to the voter mistrust,” he said. “I don’t think it’s going to work at all. They’re not giving enough credit to the people.”

Referencing the Liberal government’s previous promise to balance the budget, Ms. Jones commented that Premier Wynne could no longer be trusted to lead the province forward.

“We will not forget that the Liberal’s promised to balance the budget, but have now presented a \$6.7 billion deficit. We will not forget the \$8 billion wasted on e-health, and the \$1.1 billion wasted cancelling gas plants. We will not forget that the Wynne Liberals have doubled Ontario’s debt to more than \$325 billion. The Wynne Liberals breaking their promise to balance the budget will hurt families. The interest in the debt alone costs taxpayers more than \$1 billion a month.”

She concluded, “We can do better. We need to do better. And under a Doug Ford Progressive Conservative government, we will do better.”

## Inclement weather leaves more than 5,500 homes without power in Shelburne and Dufferin County

Shelburne felt the full wrath of mother nature on Wednesday as a winter storm, which brought freezing rain and strong winds to the community, knocked out power for more than 5,500 homes in the area.

Hydro One reported early in the afternoon that thousands of customers were left without power after winds of up to 100 kilometres an hour apparently knocked out a main line.


The organization reported that crews were on site in an attempt to fix the issue, but no restoration time was given. As of press time, power had still not been restored

in the community, with Hydro One telling residents the earliest it would be back up is 10 p.m.

Mayor Ken Bennington took to social media to notify residents of the downtime. Residents were urged to contact Hydro One for any updates.

One image taken and shared on social media displayed a hydro pole broken in half beside the Shelburne Golf & Country Club on Highway 124, with crews on site.

Hundreds of other homes across Dufferin County found themselves without power too as the winter system roared through the region.

The public meeting is scheduled to start at 7:00 p.m., or as shortly thereafter as possible, and will be held in the Council Chambers at the Municipal Office, 203 Main Street East, Shelburne.


The purpose of the meeting is to consider a Draft Plan of Subdivision and Amendment to the Town of Shelburne Zoning By-law No. 38-2007. These applications (File Nos. DPS 18/01 and Z18/01) were deemed complete and circulated with Notice of Complete Applications given on January 5, 2018.

The land subject to the proposed Draft Plan of Subdivision and Zoning By-law Amendment is located in the north-east quadrant of the intersection of Highway 10/89 and County Road 124. The subject property has a municipal address of 900 Main Street East and is legally described as Part of the West Half of Lot 1, Concession 1, Old Survey, in the Town of Shelburne, County of Dufferin. The subject property is 38.4 hectares in area and is currently vacant. A map showing the location of the subject property is provided below.

The purpose and effect of the Draft Plan of Subdivision application is to permit a proposed development consisting of lots and blocks for commercial and residential land uses, including 47 condominium townhouse dwelling units, 55 street townhouse dwelling units, 218 single detached dwelling units, as well as blocks for a park, open space, stormwater management facility, natural heritage system and buffer blocks, and a sanitary pump station. The development is proposed to be accessed via an internal road network with full movement accesses at two proposed new intersections, one on Highway 10/89 and one on County Road 124.

The purpose and effect of the related application for Zoning By-law Amendment is to re-zone the property from the Special Commercial Four Exception 3 Holding (C4-2(H)) Zone, Open Space Recreation Exception 1 Holding (OSR-1(H)) Zone, Natural Environment (NE) Zone, and the Development (D) Zone to Residential Three Exception (R3-#) Zones, Residential Five Exception # (R5-#) Zones, Mixed-Use Commercial (C2) Zone, Mixed-Use Commercial Exception # (C2-#) Zone, Open Space Recreation (OSR) Zone, and the Natural Environment (NE) Zone. The requested exceptions are requested to permit altered zone standards, including frontages, lot coverages, and building height, among others.

# Headwaters seeking nominations for 2018 Dr. David Scott Award

It's that time of the year, again. Headwaters Health Care Centre (HHCC) announced on Wednesday that it was accepting nominations for the long running Dr. David Scott Award.

Appropriately labelled one of Headwaters' most prestigious annual honours since its inception back in 2000, the Dr. David Scott Award recognizes individuals or groups who have gone above and beyond to improve the overall health and wellness of the Dufferin-Caledon community and promote links between the hospital and the community.

"This is a truly special award that we at Headwaters Health Care Centre have the privilege of presenting each and every year," HHCC Board Chair Ms. Kindree told the Free Press last April. "While it recognizes

the efforts of those in our community that works to establish a closer bond between our hospital and the public, it also serves to honour Dr. David Scott – one of Orangeville's, and indeed the hospital's, greatest ambassadors."

Dr. Scott was the first specialized doctor to practise in Orangeville. Completing his undergraduate for medicine and fellowship in general surgery in Toronto, he returned to the place he always called home in 1962. He strived for greatness throughout the entirety of his 35-year career in the local medical industry, serving as the Dufferin Area Hospital's chief of staff and board chair of the Wellington Dufferin District Health Council.

In what many see as Dr. Scott's lasting legacy in the community, he led the charge for a new hospital for Dufferin County. According to Ms. Kindree, with the community quickly

outgrowing the Dufferin Area Hospital, Dr. Scott was "instrumental" in ensuring Orangeville was at the top of the list when the provincial government announced its long-term project plans shortly before the new millennium.

While Dr. Scott officially retired from his position 20 years ago, he still finds time to volunteer in some capacity at the hospital. It's that continued commitment that ranks this award as the most important HHCC dishes out each year.

Last year's winners were Dr. Stephen Milone, an anesthetist at the hospital, and Dr. Stephanie Milone, an emergency physician. They were the first joint recipients in the award's history. The couple have been practising medicine at HHCC for more than a decade. It was their continued efforts in community service contributions, which

include volunteering, educating, mentoring and leading numerous fundraising initiatives supporting the local community, that led to their receiving the award.

Other previous award recipients have been selected for advocacy in many areas, including improving accessibility, fundraising and volunteer leadership with local organizations, improving long-term care, recruiting physicians, establishing after-hours clinics and promoting violence prevention.

The deadline for the Dr. David Scott Award nominations is Friday, May 4. The award will then be presented at HHCC's annual general meeting on June 19.



## Christian Perspectives: a little reflection goes a long way

Reflecting on the celebration of Christ’s death, burial and resurrection I was drawn to His final statement on the cross “It is finished”.

These words of Jesus imply deliberate action. Those standing nearby, observing, would have thought He was a tragic victim, put to death as a result of the anger and jealousy of others. His enemies thought they had triumphed over Him, that they had rid themselves of a threat or at the very least, a pest. Very few, if any, would have recognized the Grand Plan of the Father for the redemption of mankind.

One of the best ways this Grand Plan is illustrated is in the picture Christ gives us of Himself as a Bridegroom. I heard recently a description of the ancient Jewish wedding ceremony, and it was easy to draw the parallels between these customs and God’s plan of redemption.

When a young man reaches the age to marry, his father decides the time and the father is responsible for finding a bride for his son. Before he goes out to find a bride, the father often sends a servant ahead of him. The father chooses the bride and then sits down with her father to arrange a price for her. Once the price is decided, the groom’s father decides the timing. At the right time, the father sends the son to the bride’s home to meet the bride. The son stays there for a period of time so they can get to know each other; then the son will pay the price for the bride. After he pays it and it is accepted, he will walk around the town, yelling ‘the price has been paid in full!’ This brings a lot of excitement, because now it’s official. (Does this remind you of anything?)

The groom draws up a covenant to present to his bride; this mainly deals with his promise of protection for the bride. When it is signed, the groom will declare, “It is finished; the price has been paid in full”.

This begins the betrothal and engagement period; they are officially together, the marriage is locked in but has not been consum-

mated.

Now begins a 1 to 2 year waiting period. The groom announces, “I’m going back to my father’s house and I will prepare a place for you. And I will come back and get you”. The bride will say, “don’t go!” and he will say, “it is better for you that I go, but I will come back.” She will ask, “when will you come back?” and he will answer, “only my father knows”. He goes home to his father’s house and begins to prepare a place for them to live. The groom will send a chaperone to oversee the bride and watch her preparations and keep her true. Her oil lamp will be lit and will burn the entire waiting period, it will not go out. She will have a group of her friends around her, helping her prepare. In the period of waiting, the bride at some point will go to the temple and be immersed in water in the mikvah (the temple bath), and will come out declaring “my old life is now done and I come up out of the water to the expectation of a brand new life with my groom”. Are you drawing any parallels here?

So when the father sees the time is right, he would send his son to get his bride. His groomsmen would run ahead of him, calling, “He’s coming! He’s coming!” At the least expected time of night he would show up, a trumpet will blast, and he would steal his bride away for 7 days. At the end of the 7 days they would have a massive wedding feast.

Oh what a beautiful description of what our Lord has done for us! “It is finished” does not mean it’s over; that it’s the end. In fact, it has only started! The price for our sin has been paid in full and the bridegroom will come again for His bride, the church. We are to be ready, waiting, expecting His return to take us home to the place He is preparing for us. Come, Lord Jesus.
