## Shelburne Soccer Club requests field upgrades

The Shelburne Soccer Club has approached Town Council advocating for upgrades to the fields.

Representatives from the Shelburne Soccer Club Board - Junior Brown, Kyle Murray and Bart Wysokinski- presented a project proposal to Town Council during their meeting on Monday, April 22. The proposal highlighted various projects spanning years, which aim to improve the conditions of the fields at Greenwood Park and support the growing demand for soccer facilities in the community.

"Right now, we have an area but could it be better; absolutely," said Kyle Murray. "If we could make it a priority of this town, we could have something that potentially could really benefit not just Shelburne but Dufferin as a whole."

The project proposal to Council included a four-phase plan to improve the fields at Greenwood Park.

The first step in the project proposal from the Shelburne Soccer Club is an expansion of the soccer fields, which would meet the increasing demands for soccer facilities.

According to Shelburne Soccer Club, in

2023 the league saw nearly 400 players register for their house league, a roughly 40 per cent increase in the number of registered players.

The Shelburne Soccer Club has also seen an increase in the number of players registered for their travel team from last season, with more than 50 players registered for the 2024 season.

"Shelburne is a growing community and with that brings us challenges with registration for soccer. Every year our registration is full and we have limitations where we can't take all the kids," said Junior Brown, treasurer for Shelburne Soccer Club. "With closing registration off we have issues with parents and families leaving to neighbouring clubs. We want kids to stay in Shelburne and play soccer here. This is where we want them to play, this is where we live and this is our community."

The second project proposed by the Shel-

burne Soccer Club is to resurface Thunder Field with AstroTurf to mitigate issues such as uneven slopes, poor grass conditions, and surface irregularities caused by rain settling.

Murray explained to council that the conditions of the fields are causing barriers for players developing their skills and has also resulted in bad reception from travel teams visiting the community.

"We're hearing feedback from other rec clubs that are coming to our town and are stating this is the worst field in the league - they don't want to come," said Murray. "Not only is it impacting the perception of our town, but we're not providing a service that is conducive to kids developing skills that would allow them to participate in high level of sports."

A survey completed by the Shelburne Soccer Club showed that 50 per cent of residents, who completed the survey, don't feel safe playing on the fields.

Murray added, "As we continue to utilize the field, if we don't have a major investment into the area, we can assume that it is likely to deteriorate, especially with more kids coming onto the field."

# Shelburne Soccer Club requests field upgrades from Town Council

The third improvement to the soccer fields is the installation of lighting on Brigands Fields as a way of extending playing hours and accessibility to more ages.

"There may come a point where having one evening field isn't going to cut it and while that's okay midseason when the sun is out later, as we get closer to the end of the season, we eventually will need those

services," said Murray.

The final project proposal to Council is a long-term vision for recreation in the community and introduced the prospect of constructing a sports dome in the area. The sports dome would provide a multi-purpose indoor facility that would be able to accommodate various sports including soccer, baseball, cricket, and field hockey.

The Shelburne Soccer Club noted at the end of the presentation that they did not expect immediate action from Council, but asked for the project proposal to be considered in the Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

The Shelburne Soccer Club offers programs for children ages 3 to 17 and is run by a team of volunteer executive mem-

bers and coaches. All house league games are played at Greenwood Park's Thunder Field.

The Town of Shelburne announced in early April, that Thunder Field would be undergoing spring maintenance and grass repairs to prepare for the upcoming soccer season.

# Yoga in the Park to return to Shelburne, offering free classes

Shelburne residents will be able to stretch and move into the warmer seasons with the return of free yoga sessions in the park.

Shelburne Family Chiropractic & Wellness Centre and Apex Team Real Estate have announced the return of Yoga in the Park as well as new features coming to the program.

The complimentary yoga classes, known as Yoga in the Park, were started two years ago by Shelburne's Apex Team Real Estate, with the goal of promoting health and wellness in the community while also supporting the local food bank.

Inspired by the program, Shelburne Family Chiropractic & Wellness Centre reached out to the realtors about creating a partnership to expand the program to provide year-round classes.

"We thought it was a great way to bring the community together and support wellness in our community, which our clinic is all about," explained Alexandra Georgie, co-owner of Shelburne Family Chiropractic & Wellness Centre. "Both of us believe in supporting the wellness of our community and yoga can be a crucial piece of that because it is a fantastic activity that not only forms community but also stimulates movement and positive exer-

cise, which leads to stronger mental health."

In the fall of last year, the two businesses began offering free winter yoga sessions, which were held at the agricultural centre. The program quickly outgrew the space and at the beginning of January, moved to Trinity United Church, located on Owen Sound Street.

Georgie said they see an average of 25 participants for each class but have also seen as many as 40 people in a session.

Adult classes of Yoga in the Park will begin on June 17 at 7 p.m. at Greenwood Park and will run until August 26. Classes will be led by Penny Leimbrock of Mindful Body Nutrition.

As part of expanding the free yoga program, Shelburne Family Chiropractic & Wellness Centre and Apex Team Real Estate will be introducing a yoga class specifically for kids ages 11 and under.

Kids Yoga will begin on May 1 at Trainer Games with kids 6 and under scheduled for 6 p.m. to 6:25 p.m. and kids ages 7 to 11 from 6:30 p.m. to 7 p.m. The classes will be led by instructor Lindsey McFarlane Costard of Soham Yoga.

"She has additional training and focus because kids' yoga is a very different practice compared to adult yoga, so we're really excited to work with her," said Georgie.

A significant part of the complimentary yoga program is the food donation collection for the Shelburne Food Bank. In lieu of having to pay,

participants are instead asked to bring items to donate to the food bank.

"The community has been very generous with providing a food bank donation. We've made several drop-offs to the food bank the past two years," said Georgie. "It's a win, win overall. We're stimulating wellness and pos-

itive community through activity while also supporting those experiencing challenged in feeding themselves, which is equally as important."

No Registration or signup is required to attend the Yoga in the Park or Kids Yoga sessions. All sessions are free.

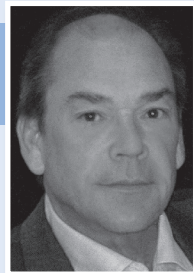
## Your grandson is in jail

I'm pretty sure that guy has been in and out of jail several times over the years and probably complains every time he is arrested – rather than just making an effort to live a quality life. Scams have always been a thing, but over the past decade, maybe a little longer, they have been taken to a new level. Much of the time, it doesn't take a lot to realize someone is trying to pull the wool over your eyes and steal your money. When you get a call from Revenue Canada, but the official 'agent' is speaking with a thick Indian accent, you're probably not fooled. I received a call from a lawyer demanding funds for an imaginary fine be paid immediately, or the 'FBI' would be paying me a visit, I laughed and said, 'wrong country', and hung up. Recently I received an official call from Microsoft, informing me that my computer had been infected with a serious virus and I would need to let him take over my computer and pay a fee to have the virus

removed. This guy, I jerked around a little. I told him he was calling the maintenance shack at the local golf course. I then pretended to follow his directions, having a little fun myself. Finally, I called him a few inappropriate names and hung up. The problem is that some of these scammers have taken things to a very sophisticated level. The 'grandparent scam' is a particularly egregious method of trying to steal someone's money. The criminal calls an elderly person and poses as one of their grandchildren, telling them they have been arrested and need money for legal fees. Sometimes another person claiming to be someone in law enforcement gets on the phone and says if a sum of money isn't paid immediately for legal reasons, the grandson will be heading off to jail. Many people have been victims of this scam. They pay the money because they are worried their grandchild is in serious trouble. It's thought many cases haven't been reported because some people are too embarrassed to admit they fell for it.

What kind of creep would try to scam a senior citizen out of their hard-earned life savings? That's about as low as you can get. The OPP announced they had arrested 14 members of an organized gang that was targeting seniors with this grandparent scam. An arrest is not enough. It may temporarily stop this gang from operating, but others will step in and take over. Unless the courts start taking these cases seriously, it will continue. The information on the arrests does not say what charges were laid in the case, but presumably, they are fraud-related. The courts never seem to do much about fraud cases. A slap on the wrist and the criminals are free to roam. It is horrible that a person is fooled into giving up their life savings in a scam of this sort. The courts need to set a precedent and slam these 14 fools with some serious penalties and let others know that this will not be tolerated in our society.

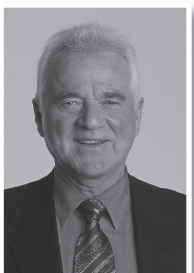
## Canada moves closer to point of no return when it comes to our national debt

There's an old bit of wisdom courtesy of Ernest Hemingway that you go broke two ways: first gradually, then suddenly. With last week's federal budget, Canada is inching closer to the sudden phase of fiscal disaster. The Canadian government projects another five years of deficit spending and over a hundred billion dollars added to our already crushing debt. Worst of all, there is no end in sight to government borrowing, and no plan in place to repay that money. It reminds you of the old German proverb: "He who is quick to borrow is slow to pay." Last week's budget also projects that public debt charges – the interest we're paying on the debt – will climb from just over \$54 billion currently to nearly \$65 billion five years from now, a 20 percent increase. Ten cents of every dollar of revenue the government brings in is now going straight to interest payments, according to TD Bank, and those interest payments are eating up a bigger and bigger portion of the budget. What's worse, for the first time ever, interest payments on the debt exceed the amount of money the government spends annually on healthcare. A Fraser Institute report on government debt published earlier this year had this

grim warning: "Rising government debt has severe consequences for Canadians as more and more resources are directed toward interest payments and away from programs that help families or improve Canada's economic competitiveness." Although the mushrooming federal debt is cause for concern, when you start adding in other levels of debt, it becomes even more dire. Combined federal and provincial net debt is projected to come in around \$2.18 trillion in 2023/24. Meanwhile, total debt in Canada – household, corporate and government debt at all levels – is now around 341 percent of total GDP. In other words, our total debt is more than three times what we produce each year. The consequences of the build-up of debt extend to all corners of the economy: our runaway debt stunts investment, hobbles economic productivity and lowers living standards. Earlier this year, University of Calgary economist Trevor Tombe said, "we should be thinking about the longer-term future of federal finances and start making difficult choices, because the longer we wait, the harder it will be." Far from making some difficult decisions, the federal government just made

our financial future a lot harder – and probably a lot more painful when the sudden day of reckoning finally arrives and jolts us from our sleep. Many things in life are not fair. One of the unfairest of all is that the older generation leaves all of the debts it has incurred to the youngest generation, asking them to pay the bill for many of the goods and services they have never even enjoyed or made use of. It's ironic that a budget which aims to make life easier and more affordable for young Canadians has instead placed upon them a heavy burden that they will never be able to throw off in their lifetimes. But a national Economic Charter of

Rights and Responsibilities, which I've been strongly advocating for the past year, would get Canada back on the straight and narrow. The charter would require government to balance the budget and reduce our national debt by 5 percent per year over 20 years with the result that we would be debt-free within two decades. We'd wipe the slate clean for the young Canadians and give them a shot at a better quality of life. 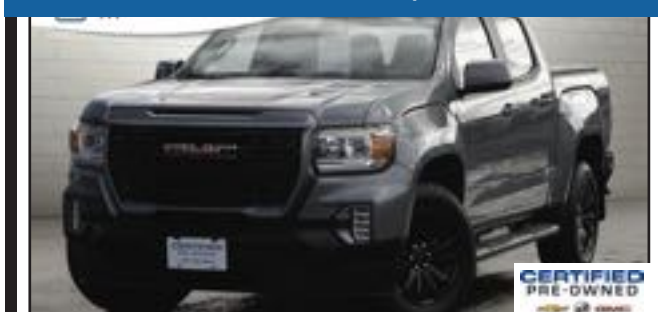

# Shelburne man charged in drug seizure in Orangeville

Methamphetamine, fentanyl and cocaine are among the drugs seized by Dufferin Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) when conducting a search warrant at a house in Orangeville that was searched just two months prior.

A property on Fourth Ave. in Orangeville saw police execute a search warrant on April 19 with the Dufferin Community Street Crime Unit, Dufferin OPP officers and members of the Offender Management and Apprehension Program (OMAP).

A search was conducted on Feb. 22 at the same house that resulted in a litany of drug and theft charges for four individuals, two of which were charged again as a result of the April 19 search warrant.

The most recent search warrant resulted in the arrest of four people who are facing multiple charges.

Rory SIEGEL, 42-year-old from Shelburne has been charged with:

- Possession of a Schedule I substance -

other drugs

Lorne STOCKDALE, 45-year-old from Orangeville

- Possession of a Schedule I substance - Opioid

David TEGGART, 46-year-old from Orangeville has been charged with:

- Possession of a Schedule I substance for the purpose of trafficking - Opioid

- Possession of a Schedule I substance for the purpose of trafficking - Cocaine

- Possession of a Schedule I substance for the purpose of trafficking - Methamphetamine

- Possession of proceeds of property obtained by crime - under \$5,000

Karen WHITING 47-year-old from Orangeville has been charged with:

- Possession of a schedule I substance for the purpose of trafficking - Methamphetamine

- Traffick in Schedule I substance - Other drugs

- Possession of a Schedule I substance for the purpose of trafficking - Cocaine

- Possession of a Schedule I substance for the purpose of trafficking - Other drugs

- Possession of proceeds of property obtained by crime - under \$5,000

There is one outstanding individual with charges pending. None of the listed charges have been proven in court.

Both Karen Whiting and David Teggart were charged with similar offences during a search warrant at the same house on Fourth Avenue on Feb. 22.

At that time, Teggart was charged with possession of a schedule I substance for the purpose of trafficking (methamphetamine), possession of a schedule I substance (cocaine), and possession of a schedule I substance (Opioid). Whiting faced charges for possession of a schedule I substance for the purpose of trafficking (methamphetamine), possession of a schedule I

substance for the purpose of trafficking (cocaine) possession of a schedule I substance (Opioid) - two counts, possession of a schedule III substance, and possession of proceeds of property obtained by crime (under \$5,000).

# The Mom Market to hold event in Shelburne for first time

Shelburne residents will have the opportunity to shop from some well-known small businesses, as The Mom Market brings their first-ever event to the community.

The spring-themed vendors market will be held at Wow Studio, located at 116 Main St., Shelburne, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Sunday (April 28), with nearly 20 locally-based small businesses.

“We’re really excited, it’s going to be a fun-filled day,” said Joy Bhikam, director of The Mom Market’s Orangeville division. “It’ll be really nice to learn what products, services and offerings are available through your local community, and through your neighbours who have all these hidden talents.”

The Mom Market was started in Nova Scotia by founder Jasmine Ancona in 2019 to provide moms, who operate part-

time small businesses, with a marketplace where they could bring their products to the general public. Since its launch five years ago, the market has grown to include 30 divisions from coast to coast.

Bhikam took over as the newest director of the Orangeville division of the Mom Market in January, after previously being involved in the event as a vendor, marketing her own business – Petals Foral Studio.

“There’s a lot of talent that is hidden away and I feel like a lot of small businesses really struggle to get their products, services and offerings out to the general public,” said Bhikam. “I’m really trying to grow this to make it a full-blown marketplace for any small business that really wants to get their name known and bring their business out to the markets.”

Part of helping to grow the market scene for local small businesses is the expansion to include events in other communities within Dufferin County.

The upcoming vendors market in Shelburne will be the first time the event has been held within the community. The markets have primarily been held in Orangeville in the past.

“I think Shelburne often gets overlooked. When we’re talking about Dufferin County, Orangeville being closer to Toronto just always pops up first. I feel like Shelburne has grown considerably and I don’t see any reason why there shouldn’t be these events [there]. We really need to make it a priority if we’re going to be highlighting local businesses and shopping local,” said Bhikam.

The Mom Market in Shelburne will feature a variety of products for local small businesses including whipped luxury shea butter, soaps, candles, jewelry and clothing.

“There’s a little bit of everything for everyone. We have a whole mix of vendor offerings. With the market, we don’t like

to replicate the product offering because it’s not fair for the vendors or for the shoppers,” said Bhikam.

The Mom Market will be catering to families and young kids with a craft table, character photos, and loot bags. During the event, The Mom Market will also be collecting food items to donate to the Shelburne Food Bank, Shepherd’s Cupboard. Visitors are encouraged to bring an item to contribute, if possible.

Speaking with the Free Press, Bhikam noted the importance of providing a marketplace for businesses and residents to connect.

“It creates a really good relationship within your community and community really is everything when you’re living in a small town.”

# Collaboration to improve palliative care in Dufferin and Caledon

Local groups are working to improve access and quality of palliative care services in Caledon and Dufferin County.

The Hills of Headwaters Collaborative Ontario Health Team (HOHC OHT), in collaboration with Bethell Hospice and the HOHC OHT’s palliative care working group, recently secured funding for a clinical coach through Ontario Health.

Bethell Hospice executive director Margaret Paan said the clinical coach will guide and support the implementation of a framework to improve access to, and quality of, hospice

palliative care in Dufferin and Caledon.

The HOHC OHT’s integrated palliative care model is focused on earlier identification and improved connection for those in need of palliative care.

“We are so proud of the work being done locally and are thrilled to receive funding to help further this work,” said Paan. “The success of our application for funding from Ontario Health is a testament that by working collaboratively, we can accomplish more than the sum of our parts.”

Paan said with rapid population growth, Dufferin and Caledon have a great need to bolster current palliative care services to

keep up with changing demographics.

The new clinical coach is going to lead implementation of the HOHC OHT’s integrated palliative care model; create a single intake for palliative care services in collaboration with primary and acute care providers; provide support to community nurses and primary care providers focused on palliative care; and develop an interdisciplinary team for further coordination.

Tracy Coffin is the executive director of the HOHC OHT. She said the clinical coach will help improve access to palliative care services and increase the number of health care professionals who can provide those

services.

“Our goal is to identify those who require palliative care services earlier in their care journey and provide them and their caregivers with quality care and support,” said Coffin. “This work would not be possible without the financial support of the Ontario Palliative Care Network (OPCN), and the tireless efforts of HOHC OHT’s palliative care working group. Their dedication and commitment to improving care in our community is truly inspiring.”

In the coming months, Bethell Hospice, the OPCN, and HOHC OHT will be working together to recruit the clinical coach.

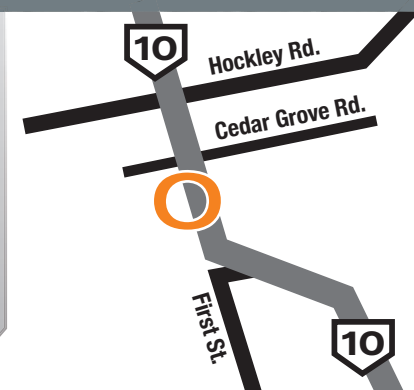



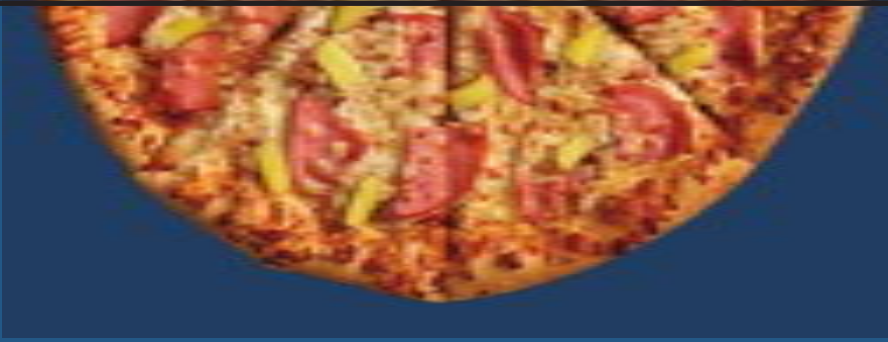
